**Re: First Nations Child and Family Caring Society, Assembly of First Nations et al  
v. Attorney General of Canada - Tribunal File #: T1340/7008**

Further to the Final Written Submissions by the Caring Society regarding the allegations of retaliation, filed in this matter on August 3, 2013, please be advised that the Caring Society would like to revise the Remedies set out on page 25, paragraphs 67-68, to more closely reflect the request made in the Caring Society's Statement of Particulars.

Specifically, the Caring Society and Dr Blackstock, as a personal victim of the discriminatory practice, seek the following remedies:

- a) An order obliging AANDC and the Department of Justice to cease its retaliatory conduct towards the Caring Society and Dr. Blackstock;
- b) An order directing all AANDC and Justice officials involved in the retaliatory actions to undergo human rights and privacy training;
- c) \$20,000 in damages under s. 53(2)(e) of the Act to Dr. Blackstock which she will donate to the charity of her choice;
- d) \$20,000 in damages under s. 53(2)(e) of the Act to the Caring Society;

- e) \$20,000 in damages under s. 53(3) of the Act to Dr. Blackstock which she will donate to the charity of her choice;
- f) \$20,000 in damages under s. 53(3) of the Act to the Caring Society; and
- g) An order directing the Minister of AANDC to issue a written and public apology to Dr Blackstock and the Caring Society.

You will note that this letter has been copied to all the other parties. Kindly forward to the Panel hearing this case.
