PART I – STATEMENT OF FACT

- 1. Herein, Chiefs of Ontario ("COO") responds on both the Attorney General of Canada's ("Canada") motion for a stay of the orders of the Canadian Human Rights Tribunal ("Tribunal") ordered at 2019 CHRT 39 ("Compensation Decision") and the motion by the First Nations Child and Family Caring Society of Canada ("Caring Society") to hold Canada's motion for a stay in abeyance.
- 2. COO adopts the facts as articulated by the Caring Society in its memorandum of fact and law filed in the within motion.

PART II – QUESTIONS IN ISSUE

- 3. COO submits that these motions raise the following issues:
 - a. Did Canada meet the high threshold of showing that a stay of the Compensation Decision is warranted?
 - b. Should Canada's application for judicial review of the Compensation Decision be held in abeyance pending the final determination of the compensation process by the Tribunal?

PART III – ARGUMENT

- 4. COO supports the positions of the Canadian Human Rights Commission and the Caring Society and adopts their submissions. Canada's motion to stay the Tribunal's Compensation Decision ought to be dismissed.
- 5. COO supports the Caring Society's motion to hold Canada's application for judicial review in abeyance pending a final decision by the Tribunal on compensation and adopts their submissions

PART IV – ORDER SOUGHT

- 6. COO seeks an order:
 - a. Dismissing Canada's motion for a stay of the enforcement and execution of the Canadian Human Rights Tribunals orders in 2019 CHRT 39; and
 - b. Holding Canada's application for judicial review in abeyance; and
 - c. COO does not seek costs, and asks the Court not to award costs against it.
